Gentlemen

I am responding on behalf of Commissioner Grannis to your correspondence dated August 27, 2009 wherein you request that the Department of Environmental Conservation take action to remove a steel cable installed across Shingle Shanty Brook and enforce a public right of navigation at said location, among other items. The waterbodies are located on private lands now or formerly of Friends of Thayer Lake, LLC; however, it is your opinion that certain portions of Shingle Shanty Brook and Mud Pond, though located on private lands, are impressed with a public right of navigation.

The Department is committed to preparing a comprehensive response to your letter. As you can imagine, this will take some time given the careful consideration required by the Department's technical and legal staff, possible coordination with the State Office of the Attorney General, and the need to balance a variety of demands with limited resources.
