On behalf of New York State and the Olympic Regional Development Authority, we submit this proposal to host the bobsleigh, skeleton, and luge events for the Milano Cortina 2026 Olympic Winter Games. New York's storied Olympic history – kept alive through significant investments in ORDA's world-class facilities and a steady stream of high-caliber competitions in Lake Placid – provides a ready and proven solution for the sliding sports in 2026. The State of New York and Lake Placid are seasoned in hosting international events. Since hosting its first Winter Olympics Games in 1932, Lake Placid has been a stage for the world's elite sporting events. The international appeal and world-class events continue today with hundreds of championships and competitions including the Lake Placid 2023 FISU World University Games Winter this past January 12-22.

The Mt Van Hoevenberg Sliding Center in Lake Placid offers an ideal location that can meet both the International Bobsleigh and Skeleton Federation's (IBSL) and the International Luge Federation's (FIL) requirements for Olympic bobsleigh, skeleton and luge competition. The facility annually hosts international competitions including World Cups and World Championships and the track is considered to be one of the world's most technically challenging tracks.

Bringing the sliding events back to New York for a record third time is important to continuing the legacy of the Lake Placid region. Since 1981, it has been our mission to preserve the facilities and keep the Olympic spirit alive. In partnership with Lake Placid, New York City will welcome and celebrate the athletes. New York is an incredibly open, vibrant, and culturally diverse state in an ideal broadcast time zone with Italy. The mountain-to-metropolitan concept provides a compelling solution to host and inspire a new generation through sport, culture, and education in partnership with Milano Cortina.

For decades, New York State's commitment to winter sports has kept the Olympic flame burning bright in Lake Placid. We would be honored to provide the Milano Cortina 2026 with a solution that offers not only the assurance of knowing the sliding events are in good hands in a two-time Olympic host city, but an opportunity to tap into the largest media market in the world and one of the largest and most iconic outposts of the Italian diaspora. MT VAN HOEVENBERG

The Sliding Center at Mt Van Hoevenberg is a world-class, state-of-the-art facility featuring a mile-long IBSF and FIL homologated bobsled, luge, and skeleton track at the site of the 1932 and 1980 Olympic Winter Games. Through years of elite international competition and regularly hosting FIL and IBSF World Cups, the combined track has earned a global reputation among the world's top sliders as one of the most technically challenging. For the tenth time, the IBSF World Championships will be held at Mt Van Hoevenberg in 2025.

Since its inception in 1930, Mt Van Hoevenberg has hosted two Olympic Games and 10 World Championships. Recent upgrades and modernizations have transformed the facility into a four-season venue that includes the Mountain Pass Lodge, centrally located between the sliding track and a 55-kilometer Nordic Ski and Biathlon Center. The Mountain Pass Lodge is a 5,110 square meter (55,000 sq. ft) facility with two retail spaces, a restaurant and bar, a large media work room, competition service suites, VIP rooms, a climbing wall and refrigerated indoor bobsled/skeleton start facility.

Recent improvements to the track include an expanded start deck area, a refined refrigeration system, energy-efficient lighting, a TV broadcast compound with an enhanced fiber system infrastructure, renovated administrative building, and the incorporation of several spectator decks to enhance the overall experience for audiences on race days.


























NEW YORK STATE OLYMPIC REGIONAL DEVELOPMENT AUTHORITY

Established in 1982, the Olympic Regional Development Authority was created by the State of New York following the 1980 Olympic Winter Games to manage, market, maintain, and provide first-class facilities for training and competitions at all venues. The organization and its mission is still firmly in place today, providing an economic engine for the entire region through increased tourism and jobs. Many of these jobs are year-round at all the various Olympic Authority venues. These Olympic venues and the Olympic Authority's operational expertise have provided the platform for elite athletic training and competition. Additionally, Mt Van Hoevenberg has a team of dedicated and knowledgeable local and regional volunteers. Numerous assigned officials from various federations are well acquainted with venue staff, volunteers, and facilities.

Departments within the 65+ person Olympic Authority administrative structure can support and work in collaboration with the Milano Cortina 2026 organizing committee. These departments have seasoned professionals and in partnership, can minimize expenses and maximize efforts.



The Olympic Authority is aligned with the IOC goal of developing healthy, capable and resilient young athletes, while attaining widespread, inclusive, sustainable, and enjoyable participation and success for all levels of individual athletic development. We facilitated over 95,000 winter sport training and competition sessions for beginner to Olympic athletes at our venues in 2022-2023.















DECADES OF EXPERIENCE

The 1932 Olympic Winter Games in Lake Placid marked the first time the Olympic Winter Games had been held in North America – and the first outside Europe – bringing worldwide recognition of Lake Placid. Then came 1980 and the Olympic Winter Games again put Lake Placid on the map internationally as a destination resort and provided some of the most inspiring performances and unforgettable moments in the history of winter sports. The international appeal and world-class events continue today with hundreds of championships and competitions across multiple sport disciplines. As a result, the Olympic Authority has brought millions of athletes and spectators to the State of New York.

Just this past winter, the Olympic Authority hosted over 50 sporting events and tournaments, including the biggest event since the 1980 Olympic Winter Games, the Lake Placid 2023 FISU World University Games. An additional 50 events will be hosted this winter, including four World Cups, of which two are in sliding sports: FIL Luge World Cup and IBSF World Cup Bobsled & Skeleton.

ITALIAN TEAM TRAINING

The Sliding Center at Mt Van Hoevenberg is revered as a competitive track that provides fair play opportunities to nations worldwide. It has long been known as an incubator of small nations and the home of many sliding nations without tracks. Lake Placid is proud to continue this legacy by the Olympic Authority extending Mt Van Hoevenberg as a training site for the Italian Team and to call Lake Placid its home sliding venue. This includes access to the Start Facility (bobsled/skeleton) as well as the Sliding Center at Mt Van Hoevenberg. A separate agreement between the Italian National Federation and the Olympic Regional Development Authority will be developed and may include:

- Pre-Games Per Season up to 40 hours of training time in Start Facility Bobsled/Skeleton
- January 2024 to March 2024 up to 40 hours of ice time
- November 2024 to March 2025 up to 80 hours of ice time
- November 2025 to February 2025 up to 60 hours of ice time
- 1 Sled Garage and Storage of Sleds
- Access to Repair and Welding Equipment for Sleds
- Access to Training Rooms / Weight Equipment
- Post Games per year up to 40 hours of training time in Start Facility Bobsled/Skeleton
- () Up to 100 hours of ice time at the Sliding Center per year





NEW YORK STATE

New York State has a rich, competitive sports foundation and is seasoned in hosting sporting events. The State is also home to the greatest number of people with Italian heritage (3.1 million) in the world, second only to Argentina.

A New York State partnership to host the sliding and ancillary events between New York City and Lake Placid presents Milano Cortina 2026 with a distinct opportunity to provide athletes with a unique experience. Lake Placid has a storied Olympic past, hosting two previous Winter Olympics, 1932 and 1980, and now reimagined with investment by the State of New York – a climate-reliable host poised for competition at the highest level.

New York State has one of the nation's most ambitious climate plans and is a leader in sustainability and legacy initiatives, aligning with the International Olympic Committee's Olympic 2020+5 Agenda. The Adirondack-Abruzzo Park Exchange was created in 1997, and the two parks, one in the United States and the other in Italy, share a long history. The Adirondack Park which is encompassed by Lake Placid and dozens of communities, spans over 5 million acres (2.02 hectares) and is an international symbol of sustainability for its mix of public and private land as well as its concentration of visitors and tourist amenities at the edge of large expanses of forest and mountain wilderness. The State and regions are committed to equal rights, diversity and inclusiveness at every level.











LAKE PLACID

Season after season, year after year, Lake Placid and the Olympic Region has successfully played host to internationally acclaimed events. The Olympic Regional Development Authority, along with the Regional Office of Sustainable Tourism carry local expertise and will support the various aspects of the event from the field of play to hospitality.

Lake Placid will be the central location for the sliding events as well as enrichment and entertainment. This concentrated area is closely surrounded by the towns of Wilmington and Saranac Lake, and slightly further Plattsburgh (80 km), Potsdam and Canton (110 km) and Lake George (130 km).



The people of the Lake Placid Olympic Region are the essence of competition and the Olympic spirit, whether hosting, cheering, competing, or volunteering. The region's rich heritage and decades of elite training and competition have developed a way of life and a commitment to excellence in sports. The spirit of the place is impactful, and the athletes who train and compete here, feel it. From the grocery store to the training site, they feel at home. International athletes, families, and guests are a natural part of the fabric of the Lake Placid Olympic Region and the community looks forward to welcoming the Milano Cortina 2026 sliding sport athletes.













NEW YORK CITY

The international melting pot of the world where more than 800 languages are spoken, New York City is a truly magical place. It is home to a staggering 12 professional sports teams and is one of the largest media markets in the world, including ABC, CBS, Fox, CNN, MSNBC, and home of the long-time rights-holding broadcaster, NBC.

WELCOME TO NEW YORK CITY, TOO - CONCEPT

John F. Kennedy (JFK) airport will serve as a point of entry for arrivals and departures. It will also be the entry point for sleds and equipment customs.

New York City will provide a Celebration Center at Rockefeller Center for the Milano Cortina 2026 Olympic Winter Games – Feb. 5-23, 2026. The Celebration Center will host three to four medal ceremonies after each sport discipline during the time period of the Games.

Luge medal ceremony - February 13, 2026*

Skeleton medal ceremony - February 15, 2026*

Bobsled medal ceremony - February 17, 2026*

*All dates are approximate (based on the Beijing schedule) and include a travel day from Lake Placid to New York City. Flower ceremonies will take place at the Awards Plaza at Mt Van Hoevenberg in Lake Placid with medal ceremonies to follow in New York City at Rockefeller Center at the conclusion of all events for each sport discipline. Athletes and their delegations can experience the city and continue to Milan for the Games and Closing Ceremonies on February 22, 2026. Concept elements include a secure location with set-up over a~15-day period with podium, mini sliding track,

engagement with NBC and athlete interviews on the Today Show with their medals, viewing parties, athlete meet and greet, cultural integration (Italian American culture aligning with Milano Cortina 2026), and engagement with prominent actors, business people, restauranteurs of Italian American descent and highlighting the Italian diaspora.

ACCOMMODATIONS AND ATHLETE'S VILLAGE CONCEPT

The immediate Lake Placid area has approximately 3,000 rooms in privately owned hotels and rental properties. Surrounding regional towns and cities have over 6,000 rooms (hotels/motels/inns/B&B's). As

the host city, Lake Placid, along with regional towns and villages, will provide accommodations to athletes, delegation officials, technical officials, Olympic Family, media, volunteers and spectators. Lake Placid proposes two scenarios for accommodations and the Athletes' Village, of which one will be determined and finalized with further planning and feedback.

U.S. OLYMPIC & PARALYMPIC TRAINING CENTER

The U.S. Olympic and Paralympic Training Center (USOPTC) in Lake Placid is a world-renowned training facility for American athletes preparing for the Olympic and Paralympic Games. The USOPTC offers facilities that include a weightlifting and fitness center, a sports medicine and rehabilitation center, and a high-altitude training facility. The USOPTC has recently renovated and modernized dormitory-style housing for athletes and coaches, as well as dining facilities and a conference center. Team USA will be housed in the main residence hall and Team Italy in the international wing, with both teams having full access to the amenities at the USOPTC.

PAUL SMITH'S COLLEGE

Athlete and delegation accommodations and Athlete's Village

Paul Smith's College is a private college on a 14,000-acre campus, one of the largest college campuses in the world. Campus facilities include top-quality fitness center, 40-foot (12 meters) ropes course, two gymnasiums, soccer/rugby field, indoor pool, unique head-to-head woodsmen's arena, state-of-the-art esports lab, and more. Recently used for the Lake Placid 2023 FISU World University Games.

CONCEPT B

LAKE PLACID VILLAGE HOTELS

Hotel and private rental accommodations are concentrated and in close proximity to this area. In this concept, Team USA and Team Italy will also be accommodated at the Olympic Training Center. The remaining hotel accommodations and temporary housing from Lake Placid to Plattsburgh, Potsdam, Canton, Malone, and the Lake George region will be formalized to accommodate technical officials, media, volunteers, games stakeholders, workforce, and contractors, with the Olympic Family and Milano Cortina 2026 OCOG staff located at a dedicated hotel. An efficient transportation system will be provided to participating housing locations, as well as accommodations that are further from Lake Placid center.

ATHLETE'S VILLAGE

Within walking distance of the hotels, the Lake Placid Conference Center has 3,344 square meters (90,000 square feet) of flexible meeting and exhibition space with a total of 12 breakout rooms available for concurrent sessions, state-of-the-art audio visual technology, a ballroom, and a full-service production kitchen. The Lake Placid Conference Center would act as the main dining hall for athletes and would remain in operation for a total of 40 days from preopening to official closing.



The Village of Lake Placid lies within the Town of North Elba, and together, the two local government authorities successfully manage complex operations in a small village that attracts more than 600,000 visitors annually. Within the responsibilities of these local authorities are the provision of fire prevention, safety, and rescue operations; policing, crime prevention and investigation, and the maintenance of public order; airport, water, sewer, electric, local highway maintenance, and recycling and waste.

Providing safe, reliable, and efficient transportation, security, and other essential services are also the domain of local and State law enforcement, the U.S. Office of Homeland Security, and a host of State and Federal governmental agencies.

AOF will establish, in conjunction with the New York State Department of Education and the Olympic Authority, a statewide education program within schools that promote Olympism/Paralympism and mirrors the program that AOF partnered on in Milano Cortina Gen26. AOF will assist, guide and support this initiative starting first in the Olympic Region for the 2024-2025 school year.

AOF will continue their partnership with the Olympic Authority on existing and future initiatives related to art, fashion, and educational programs throughout the region and in connection with existing programs in Milano Cortina 2026.







The Lake Placid Olympic Museum, an official member of the IOC's Olympic Museum Network, continues to be active in the service of sport and the development of the Olympic Movement. The revamped Museum opened its doors in December 2022 and has benefited from and is augmented by the Olympic venues and programs.

Adjacent and accessible from the Museum is the Empire Room, a hospitality space for VIPs, sponsor, or athlete receptions, meetings, or events. The Museum, which boasts the second-largest Olympic collection in the world, is part of the Olympic Center and offers in-house event coordination, including IT support and food and beverage services.


